AN UNKNOWN PORTRAIT OF W.H. GILL *

There are two photographs known of W.H. Gill and there is now a portrait of the man himself to add to his likenesses.¹ It was reproduced in *The Choir* as part of a piece on Gill in 1915.² He is shown in a reflective or perhaps rather a contemplative pose, pencil and paper ready to hand for the moment when inspiration was to strike him. The reproduction here is taken from the pages of the magazine and so the quality is not of the best. As ever, one wonders where the painting is now.
