## THE REVIVAL OF THE MANX LANGUAGE (7)

### “MANX LANGUAGE SOCIETY’S PRIZES”

(1903)

On Friday afternoon of last week, the prizes offered by the Manx Language Society for the best Manx recitation were awarded to the children of Dalby and Patrick Schools. It was encouraging to find that great interest had been excited among the children, and that the number of competitors was fairly large. In the Patrick School the prizes were won by: 1. Anna Mylchreest; 2, Katie Lewin. Both gave their recitations clearly and intelligently. In Dalby School, the prize-winners were: 1, John Clark; 2, Gertrude Clark; 3, Gertrude Quirk. It is pleasing to find that interest in their language was not confined entirely to the gentler sex. All three children did very well. The Society has offered further prizes for rather more advanced recitations to be competed for at Christmas.
