“THE ORGANIST BEING INDISPOSED” *

(1936)

Mr Wilfred Watterson was the chairman at the Wesley Guild on Tuesday. The speaker was Mr Ridgway Kennaugh, of Ballasalla. The vocal tune raiser was Mr W. Watterson, the organist being indisposed. Solos were rendered by Messrs R.H. Kermodé and B.T. Haben. A quartette was given by Messrs Ridge Kennaugh, W. Watterson, R.H. Kermodé and B.T. Haben. The subject of the address was “Life” and this was discussed by Messrs Robert Kennaugh, R.H. Kermodé, W. Watterson, Harry Collister and B.T. Haben.
